YOUR JUDGES FOR 2024

Expression – Lea Beverley

Though a proud native Texan (y'all often slips out), Lea calls Bellevue, Washington state (USA) home. Formerly self-employed as a corporate tax consultant she is now blissfully retired from the financial world.

Lea was classically trained as a pianist beginning at age five and continued with 20+ hours of piano in college. She began accompanying school choirs in the 4th grade and later added performances at musicals, church and charitable events. While living in Alaska, she was invited to an SAI guest night 30+ years ago and immediately got hooked on singing a cappella. She considers herself a baritone but has competed as a chorus lead and bass as

well. Having served as chorus president, section leader, show chair and numerous other positions, she turned to regional leadership as education coordinator and regional faculty.

Lea joined the Sweet Adelines International Judging Program in 2000 and finds judging quite fulfilling – both delving into barbershop intricacies and getting to know folks around the world. She believes it's an integral function that keeps SAI musicianship constantly improving and striving for excellence. (And it's fun!). Coaching brings her a lot of joy – she loves being part of groups learning and honing their skills (and getting a barbershop 'high').

When not 'doing music', Lea loves traveling, watching sports (especially American football) and creating crafty projects. Her life became more eventful when her niece and family bought the house next door. The dulcet tones and unlimited energy of two adorable girls under six bring unrelenting pleasure, lessons in creativity and hugs.

Music – Corinna Garriock

Corinna Garriock has been a member of Sweet Adelines International since 1988. She is a Certified Music Judge, a Master Director, and the tenor of the 2012 Sweet Adelines International Quartet Champion, Martini. She also serves on the Arranger Certification Program Moderators' committee, helping to administer this educational program for Sweet Adelines arrangers. In the past, she has served on the International Faculty and the Education Direction Committee and was an Associate Director of Lions Gate Chorus in Region 26 (Vancouver, Canada) for many years. Corinna enjoys coaching and arranging and has several arrangements available through SA and SMP. She currently resides in Halifax, Nova Scotia on the east coast of Canada and is a Chapter-At-Large member in each of Region 1 and 26.





Sound – Kim Vaughn

Kim Vaughn is one of the most well-known and instantly recognised women in the field of barbershop harmony. She was the Musical Director of the San Diego Chorus of Sweet Adelines (<u>www.sdchorus.org</u>) from 1985 to 2015 and, under her dynamic and knowledgeable leadership, the San Diego Chorus won seven Regional Championship medals, numerous International medals and the International Gold medal in Portland, Oregon in 2001.

Kim's talents lie not only in her directing and teaching skills, but also in her performance accomplishments. She has won the coveted International Champion title three times, the first woman to ever do so, first in 1976 with

High Society, then in 1988 with Savvy and most recently in 2001 with A Cappella Gold.

Her work as a voice teacher and experience in barbershop harmony have made Kim a very popular coach and adjudicator as well as faculty for barbershop music schools around the world. Her contributions have resulted in a host of both male and female medallists and champions.

Kim is a Certified Sound Judge, a Master International Faculty member, a member of the Region 21 Hall of Fame and in 2014 won SAI's highest honour, the Lifetime Achievement Award.

Kim earned her Bachelor and Masters Degree in Music Education and Vocal Pedagogy at San Diego State University, where she studied with Larra Browning Henderson and Mary MacKenzie. A voice teacher by profession, Kim has her own studio consistently filled with a cappella and pop singers from around the globe – an especially true statement since adding Skype lessons and coaching to her vast repertoire of talents.

Visual Communication – Renée Porzel

Renée Porzel is the Music Director of the Melodeers Chorus. She has a deep understanding of Sweet Adelines and a proven track record of success. In her previous roles as Showmanship Coordinator and Associate Director of the Melodeers, she was responsible for the creative direction of the chorus, the development of new music initiatives, and assisted with the management of the music staff.

Renée is a member of the Sweet Adelines International Faculty Program and is a Certified Visual Communication Judge. She served on the Sweet Adelines International Board of Directors for several years, and was International President from 2012–14.

Renee coaches choruses and quartets around the world, and specialises in helping groups reach their potential visually and vocally, and reach their performance and competition goals.

Renée and her husband Bob reside in Buffalo Grove, IL. They are the proud parents of Aaron and Ethan. Bob and Renee are the lucky, and very proud, grandparents to three special and beautiful granddaughters!

Choruses must bring the List of Competing Members that is to be signed by EACH MEMBER of your chorus. Please act on this now to allow enough time. Choruses also need to bring a Chorus Pose Form. Order of Appearance

Parade of Champions

The Parade of Champions will start approximately ninety minutes after the conclusion of the Chorus Competition. We encourage performers to remain at the venue and in their contest gear for the Parade of Champions.

Parade of Champions Briefing

If your chorus or quartet is eligible to perform in the Parade of Champions, a representative from each quartet and the chorus director must attend the briefing, which will be held at the conclusion of the chorus competition in the Ballroom.

The draft line-up for the Parade of Champions is as follows:

5th Place Chorus – 1 song 5th Place Quartet – 1 song 4th Place Chorus – 1 song 4th Place Quartet – 1 song AA Winning Chorus* – 1 Song 3rd Place Chorus – 1 song 3rd Place Quartet – 1 song 2nd Place Chorus – 1 song 2nd Place Quartet – 1 song 1st Place Quartet – 2 songs 1st Place Chorus – 2 songs

* If the A and AA Chorus Winners place in the top five, they will sing in the slot determined by their top five placements.

Groups will be called from the audience when they are to muster backstage in preparation for their performance.

Quartet Chorus

The Quartet Chorus will be directed by Linda Wareham and will perform at the end of the Quartet Competition before the official announcement of results. You will be advised details about where and when to meet at the Quartet Chorus Rehearsal.

STAR Chorus

The STAR Chorus will be directed by Lea Baker and Karen Ramirez, directing *Permission to Shine* and *Weather With You*. We are excited to see the STAR Chorus take the stage at the end of the Chorus Competition, before the official announcement of results.

Guest Artists

Don't miss the opening ceremony, where we will get to hear Vocal Mix, directed by Bec Hewitt. Vocal Mix is a mixed voice a cappella chorus which performs well known contemporary arrangements in the barbershop and a cappella styles, to create entertaining and engaging performances for the audience.

While we wait for the chorus results, The Methodist Ladies' College barbershop group has been active in the college for approximately 20 years. The girls are auditioned from the College Chorale in years 9 to 12. The group has travelled to the World Choir Games four times and has achieved Bronze or Silver medals on each occasion. Their triannual European tours have been suspended since 2020 and so the singers are looking forward to travelling to Italy and Croatia in 2025 to sing at several youth festivals. Carole Macintyre has been the barbershop music director at the college since 2011.

Health and Safety Protocols

Should emergency alarms sound, please remain in the room and a convention organiser or Sweet Adelines Australia RMT member will coordinate the evacuation out to the emergency area in Esplanade Park.

In the event of a fire or emergency evacuation, you will hear a BEEPING sound over the in-house speakers. This will be an investigation signal. All delegates should remain in the room while the alarm is being investigated.

The second sound you will hear is WHOOP WHOOP WHOOP. If you are required to evacuate the building, you will hear a voice saying "Please Evacuate the Building" over the in-house speakers.

When evacuating the building, leave your belongings and exit in an orderly fashion from the emergency exits (please note that the venue fire warden/staff will indicate if the designated emergency exits are unsafe and will guide patrons to an alternate, safe exit):

With a substantial number of people gathering during convention, please take whatever precautions you feel necessary to minimise your health risks. Hand sanitiser will be stationed at various points in convention rooms for your use.

Scammer Warning

Please note that last year there were many comments from scammers on social media around convention time. Our admin team blocks these scammers as quickly as possible, but please be aware of the risk and do not click on any links in comments. Scammers often claim to have tickets for resale, or to be selling merchandise or a webcast pass for the event. All registrations must go through Cvent, session tickets can only be purchased through Trybooking, and merchandise sales can be conducted in person or on the Sweet Adelines Australia website throughout the year. As noted above, the YouTube live stream is publicly available for free, so beware of any claims of a webcast that requires a registration.


The biggest thank you to all the wonderful volunteers who have put their hands up to help us run competition days. We would be lost without them!
